

BYLAW NO. 6-05

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF WOLSELEY IN THE  
PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN TO AMEND BYLAW  
NO. 2-05 KNOWN AS THE DOG BYLAW.

The Council of the Town of Wolseley in the Province of Saskatchewan  
enacts as follows:

That section 12 & 13, entitled "Regulations Regarding Numbers of Dogs  
Per Household" be removed from the bylaw and states:


"12. No person shall possess or harbor more than two (2) dogs, in each  
household, except in the case that if that household has a litter of pups, the  
said pups need to be sold, or given away by the time they are three months  
old."


"13. Any household that already has more than 2 dogs in their household as of  
the date of passing of this bylaw, shall be permitted to keep their existing  
number of dogs. In the event they lose any of their existing dogs to death, etc.,  
they are not permitted to increase the number of dogs in their household to more  
than two (2)."

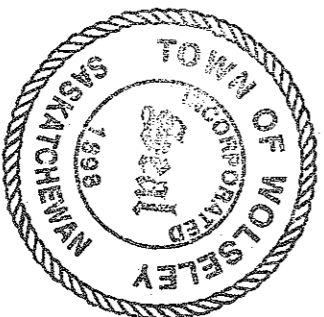
This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of final passing  
thereof.
